


Middle School Student to Student Portal Role Transition

Summary


In an effort to have all students sharing the same landing page upon login to eSchoolware, we have decided to eliminate the Middle School Student role so all students are using the regular Student Portal role. All features specific to that role are available within the Student Portal role however navigation to those features may be different. Additionally, there are many more benefits to the Student Portal role over the Middle School Student role such as overall look and feel and pacing indicators. **Note** this change has no impact on the courses offered by EdisonLearning, just the role in which students use to access the courses.

Overview/Comparison

Below is the landing page for the Student Portal role. Clicking a course name will expand all parts of the course train and you can access the course by clicking the desired course part directly. Additionally, if you are enrolled in MyDay courses you can still click the MyDay button to launch it.




For comparison purposes, below is the same student with the Middle School Student role. You can see much of the same information is present however the grade breakdowns are vertically aligned on the right side of the page whereas above they are horizontally aligned by course train. This change will result in less scrolling for the student to view their grade breakdowns.



Course Information

Clicking anywhere in the course's line will expand the course enrollment details as seen below:



This student is currently enrolled in Part 1. When that part is completed and approved, its status will change to Final. Enrolling a student into the next course part changes its status from locked to in progress.

To open the grade breakdown, click the blue box for the desired part for which you would like to view your grades.

The student can also message the course's teacher(s) by clicking the envelope button next to the teacher name as seen in the screen shot above.

Pacing

One of the biggest benefits to this transition is that pacing can be utilized for Middle School students, previously this feature was only available for users with the Student Portal role (high school students). The start date and end date for the course is visible next to the section code, **note** this is pacing purposes only - the course will not lock if the end date is breached.



The progress bar displays the overall progress within the course and the vertical line displays where the student should be to complete the course by the set end date while maintaining pace. Also, a green, yellow or red notification is seen within the grade display box where the student can access the grade breakdown. A breakdown of how pace is calculated within eSchoolware can be found below.

- 0 4 assessments behind pace: green UI indicator that student is on pace
- 5 10 assessments behind pace: yellow UI indicator that student is behind pace
- 10 or greater assessments behind pace: red UI indicator that student is behind pace

The total completed assignments as well as assignments completed within the past 7 days are visible above the progress bar as well.

Virtual Environment

The Learning Land (for K-8th graders) or Research Center (9-12th graders) can be accessed by looking at the Other Information portlet on the left side of your screen and clicking the applicable icon that is present. **Note** the institution must be enabled to have access to these environments. Last, If you are under 13 years of age, you must receive parent approval prior to accessing the Learning Land environment.
